Thoughts from the Pastor



It was the first day of the week. The women had come seeking the dead. They'd come to clean up the mess that death makes. They knew they would find blood on the linen cloth. There had been so many wounds. They came with some spices to cut the smell of death.

And so, on the first day of the week they go to the tomb. What they find is completely unexpected. They find the stone rolled away. There is a young man sitting there but the body is gone. The tomb is empty—completely empty—and they are terrified.

We know what emptiness feels like. There is the emptiness of a calendar when there is nothing to do, no plans. . .the days just stretch on and on. There is the emptiness of a chair at the dinner table when one you have loved is gone. There is the emptiness of a bed once occupied by two. Emptiness can be terrifying, leaving behind despair, hopelessness and futility.

The emptiness of the empty tomb on Easter morning was altogether different. The man who pointed to the empty tomb cried out, "The tomb is empty!" There is no sorrow in his voice. . . no despair, no hopelessness, no futility. There is only victory—victory over death.

And yet still, at first, the women were terrified. Death—that they understood. But an empty tomb? This was unheard of. Mark tells us the women ran from the tomb and said nothing to anybody. But of course we know they eventually must have said something to someone or we wouldn't be here today.

During these 50 days of Easter, may we continue to rejoice and celebrate. May we rejoice in the empty tomb. For it is because of the empty tomb that we have life. "Alleluia! Christ Is Risen! He Is Risen Indeed. Alleluia!"

(Pastor Julie would like to share the following letter she received from Pastor Bob Stover of Bear Creek Camp & Conference Center – dated 3/29/'07)

Dear Julie,

Thank you for participating in our recent campaign to gather signatures in support of the application that Bear Creek Camp and the North Branch Land Trust recently submitted for the Keystone Grant program.

We ended up collecting close to 3000 signatures from 18 counties and over 80 communities throughout eastern Pennsylvania. They were forwarded to our government legislators and administrators as a strong demonstration of the wide range of support that Bear Creek Camp has.

One legislator's office contacted us to share that few organizations have been so successful demonstrating the great support we have for this endeavor. We received letters and phone calls from several offices stating they will urge the proper people to give our application full and fair consideration.

I wish we could share with you the final results of all of our efforts, but we will not know for a number of months whether or not our application is chosen to be funded. Rest assured we will share this broadly with our churches when and if we do get selected and enter into a conservation easement.

Thanks again for all your help, and especially for your partnership in sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ through our outdoor ministry.

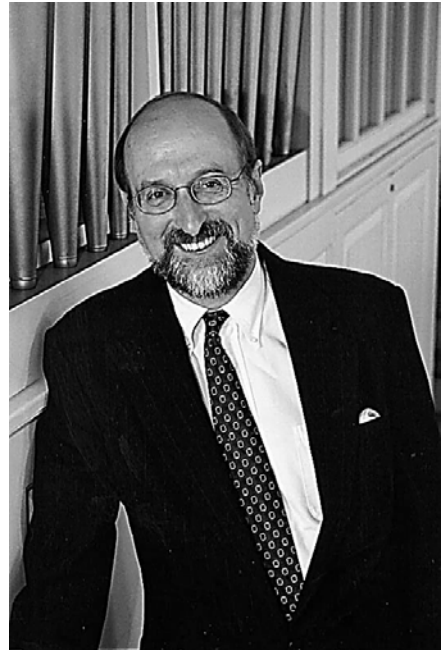
May 20 Organ Recital To Feature David Spicer

Way back in 1970, your organist was a high school student studying with the young choir director/organist of Wayne Presbyterian Church, David Spicer. At the time, young Andy felt that David Spicer was the finest organist he ever heard play.

Now, almost 40 years later, you have an opportunity to see what I did so long ago – one of the great organists of our time, playing our newly-renovated organ. The concert is **Sunday evening, May 20, at 7:30 pm**. It is free, with an offering received.

David Spicer is Minister of Music and the Arts at the First Church of Christ in Wethersfield, Connecticut, where he directs a multiple vocal and handbell choir program and produces a monthly concert series.

Before assuming the Wethersfield position in October 1986, Spicer was Director of Music at the First Presbyterian Church in Lincoln, Nebraska, and taught church music at Nebraska Wesleyan University. Prior to this he was Organist / Choirmaster at the Presbyterian Church in Wayne.



A native of Austin, Texas, Spicer received his first musical training from his parents, playing the organ in church at the age of eight. Spicer is a graduate of the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia, where he was an artist/scholar under the renowned Dr. Alexander McCurdy. Graduate studies were completed at Eastern Baptist Theological Seminary. Further organ study was done under Dr. Robert Elmore. Spicer acknowledges Dr. Virgil Fox as a source of inspiration for his own style of organ playing.

As a recitalist, David Spicer always involves his audience and likes to feel that they “walk away with a greater understanding of the king of instruments.” He is known for his transcriptions, included in every recital. Spicer is house organist at the Bushnell Center for Performing Arts in Hartford, has taught at Central Connecticut State University and is on the faculty of Tunxis Community College.

In 1997, Spicer and Dr. Harold Robles founded the Albert Schweitzer Organ Festival/USA. This national competition is for high school student organists and those in college (through age 26) – the Young Professional division. This competition, now in its tenth year, attracts outstanding organists from all across the country.

David Spicer is married to Dana, an artist and designer. They have a blended family of seven children and six grandchildren. Spicer’s interests include Biblical studies, model railroading, astronomy and sports cars. He is dedicated to the idea that Christianity and music, two of the greatest forces in our world, can effectively merge to wash away “the dust of everyday life” from our souls.

Elizabeth McCoid, Christian Education

Where were you born? Where did you grow up?

I was born in Latrobe, Penna. (most famous for Mr. Rogers, Arnold Palmer and Rolling Rock). I lived there until I was 8 years old. Then my family relocated to the suburbs of Pittsburgh. I attended The Pennsylvania State University and then moved back home for two years to finish my master's degree at Duquesne University. I moved to Philadelphia in August of 2003.

How do you spend your days? What is your calling?

I am a School Counselor for the School District of Philadelphia. I work at Mary McLeod Bethune School, which is a K - 7th grade school. Being the only counselor in a school of 630 students is very demanding, but I have enjoyed working with the families of North Philadelphia for the past four years.

One of my favorite passages is from Michah:6. It says, "Do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with your God". I feel that verse sums up my calling and it has been pretty clear to me since I was an adolescent. I have always wanted to be in a helping profession and dedicating my life to helping others in need.

What do you do in your free time?

Since moving to Philadelphia, my friends have become my family since I have no immediate family in the area. I spend most of my time with my friends. I also "enjoy" running and going to the gym.

What brought you here? What keeps you here?

When I moved to Philadelphia in the fall of 2003, I shopped around to different churches. The church that was closest in distance I never felt a strong connection to the people or the worship service. St. Paul's was recommended to me, and I instantly felt a connection through the worship service. Having been raised a "high Lutheran," I enjoy the worship, music and liturgy that St. Paul's provides weekly. That is what keeps me here.

Council Highlights

At its April 12 meeting, the Congregation Council . . .

- Viewed a video presentation highlighting some of the deferred maintenance issues at St. Paul's cemetery. Council was very supportive of the recommendations from the Cemetery Committee to address the needs of the cemetery.
- Was presented with, and approved, an updated job description for the Property Caretaker. (The new caretaker, Tom Ward, will begin in May.)
- Considered Property Committee recommendations for repairs / renovation of the caretaker's house. Council approved the project and allocated funds for it. This will complete the repairs and renovations needed for the three houses owned by St. Paul's.
- Considered a Worship and Music Committee recommendation that the two Sunday services be combined into one for the summer of 2007. The single service would begin at 9:30 am. The new schedule would begin on Sunday, June 10 and run through Sunday, September 9 (Rally Day).
- Learned from the Social Ministry Committee that St. Paul's will begin to offer a Stephen's Ministry as soon as volunteers are trained.
- Approved appointment of a Task Force to preserve and display the artwork and archives at St. Paul's under the direction of co-chairs Boofie Younkin and Frank Roth.

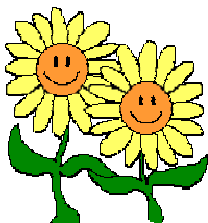
