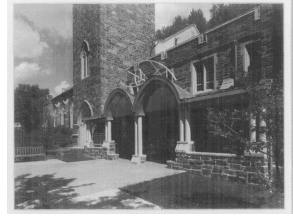

# Thoughts from the Pastor



I walked today where Jesus walked,  
in days of long ago.  
I wandered down each path He knew,  
with reverent step and slow...

My pathway led through Bethlehem...

I knelt today where Jesus knelt,

I found myself humming this hymn this morning. It's one of the good old ones whose message is timeless.

As I write this just a few days before Palm Sunday, I've been reflecting on what a meaningful and powerful journey this Lent has been for me, and I hope for you too. Many of you have commented about the beautiful liturgy we've been using, "Holden Evening Prayer."

When you page through our Sunday readings from Christmas through Easter, you really do walk where Jesus walked, from the little town of Bethlehem all the way to the Mount of Olives and Calvary and through the garden's empty tomb.

Assuming you will get this just before Easter Sunday, please do come and join us that day as we celebrate the completion of the Christmas story. Remember that the second service will start at 10:45.

I conclude with thanksgiving for all who have contributed in any way to our Wednesday and Sunday worship on this Lenten-Easter journey.

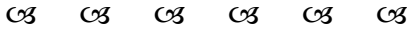

### Training Update

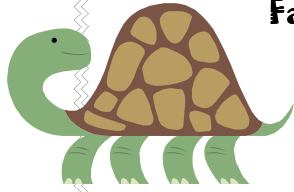
What a wonderful experience it is to be training Stephen Ministers again!

### NOTE TO USHERS

Thanks to all of you for performing this vital part of the church's ministry. If you serve as an usher, please refresh your memory of the responsibilities by reading the following:

- Arrive at church 20 minutes before the beginning of the service.
- Greet worshipers and hand them a bulletin or direct them to the box holding the bulletins when they enter the narthex.
- If you are standing outside the entry to the sanctuary, open the doors for worshipers, especially if they need help.
- **At some point during the service, go to the balcony, count the number of worshipers and enter the total in the book at the podium in the narthex. This is an important duty because we need to report the yearly attendance to the synod.**
- Collect the offering during the service and return the offering plates and the vessels containing the wine to the altar.
- **After the service clean the sanctuary by picking up all bulletins and any trash left in the pews and making sure that all hymnbooks are facing forward in the hymn racks. This is also important so that the church is left in neat condition for the next worship service.**

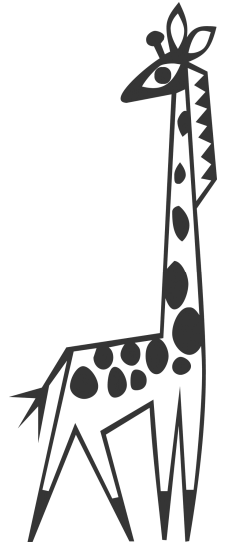
