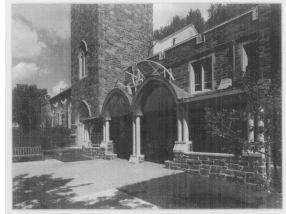

## ***An Exciting Opportunity to Keep the Music Alive!***

As you should know by now, St. Paul's magnificent organ has been serving our congregation for over 50 years. Although significant restoration has been done since 2003 under the direction of our Music Director, Andy Heller, the organ windchests are still playing on the original pipe-valve leather pouches, which are now at or past the end of their expected life and consequently must be replaced before the organ begins to malfunction. The cost of this project is somewhere between \$84,000 and \$85,000. To date we have raised \$13, 627.24 through money taken in at last year's talent show and through outright gifts.

**Here's the really exciting news:** an anonymous donor has made a generous offer to match every dollar up to \$10,000 that is donated by June 30, 2011. If we can match every one of those 10,000 dollars, all of you who are proficient in higher math can calculate that we will have added \$20,000 to our total by the end of June!

Every dollar given will bring us closer to our goal, so please remember Paul's admonition that "God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7) and consider making a gift to help preserve the organ and allow us to continue worshiping God with beautiful music.

## ★ MICHAEL CASSIDY, GEOGRAPHY BEE FINALIST

Michael Cassidy, a sixth grader at Haverford Middle School, was the second place winner of the National Geographic Society's Geography Bee recently held at his school. There are about 1300 sixth through eighth graders in the school, and only 31 answered seven questions correctly to get to the semifinals. Michael was one of the ten students to make it to the finals. It was a tough race to the finish, but Michael persevered, taking second place (the boy Michael beat for the championship last year, won first place this year). Michael was also one of the three winners in the whole school who tied for the most correct answers in the daily geography question contest. Way to go, Michael!

Shannon Moran, age 15, received the Religious Life Bronze Award at a Venturing Court of Honor ceremony on January 12. Shannon is a member of Venturing Crew 176, which meets in Ardmore and is sponsored by the Narberth Fourth of July Committee. Her active involvement as a volunteer at St. Paul's for a number of years meant that she had met many of the conditions for the award before she actively began working on the requirements. Shannon

teaches Sunday School at St. Paul's, she frequently serves as an acolyte and communion assistant for Sunday services, she has helped with Vacation Bible School, and she deepened her knowledge of the role of a pastor by interviewing Pastor Skip McDowell about his background and work. # In the vanguard:

## Innovation at St. Paul's

Dear Friends,

Each week St. Paul's offers many opportunities to assist in worship and give life to the Lutheran principle of the "priesthood of all believers." Communion assistants, acolytes, ushers, greeters, flower deliverers and others are a vital part of our weekly services.

***Altogether, close to 150 members volunteer for these ministries on a regular basis!***

Scheduling all of these volunteers is an important and complex activity. To make this process smoother, the Worship and Music Committee, after lengthy study and reflection, has decided to adopt a commercial software package specifically designed for this purpose.

***Ministry Scheduler Pro (MSP) is a web-based system that automatically builds equitable schedules for service participants, taking into account family groupings, preferred service frequencies, vacation dates, and all manner of other constraints.***

For those with access to a computer, MSP provides an online calendar and makes it easy (just a few clicks!) to request a substitute when plans change.

We will begin using MSP in February 2011. Instructions on using the system will be emailed to those volunteers who have provided an email address. For volunteers without computers, we will continue to mail printed schedules as we have always done. If you have specific dates when you prefer to serve, dates when you are not available, or any other constraints, we will be more than happy to take these into account, as always. The easiest way to inform us of these is to send an email to Millie Parker, church secretary, [millie@stpaulsardmore.org](mailto:millie@stpaulsardmore.org), or call the church office, (610) 642-3211. (more ►)

We hope that this system will work well for our congregation. Over 1400 churches have adopted MSP, and in a survey, 96% of respondents felt that the software made it easier to volunteer at their church. For those who do assist in our weekly ministries, we ask you to give us feedback on the new system, whether positive or negative. And for those who do not yet assist regularly, but would like to, we would be delighted to help you find a ministry that will help you to deepen your faith practice and worship.

# *“Raising Dough”— A Path to Inspirational Giving*

*“Raising Dough” introduces gift planning concepts and opportunities in a recipe format. These opportunities range from gifts during your lifetime to gifts made at or after death. This is the eighth in a year-long series of recipes for inspirational giving that the Stewardship Committee is presenting each month in “The Chimes.” Feel free to contact either Carol Hammarberg or Don Parman if you would like to receive the complete “recipe box” to see which opportunities might best fit your individual situation. Individual counseling through professional advisors is available at no cost if you have questions.*

## *Month 8 – IRA Gift*

Dick was a trustee of a Lutheran ministry. Mindful of 1 Corinthians 16:2 he had saved money in an IRA. When he heard about the IRA provision of the Pension Reform Act of 2006, he acted. For the first time, people who were 70½ could give part (up to \$100,000) of their IRA directly to charity. In the past, IRA owners had to withdraw funds first and pay federal and state taxes. Now Dick could instruct his IRA custodian to send a gift directly to the agency. The withdrawal would offset his “minimum required distribution” reducing his usual taxable income. In IRS parlance it is called a “qualified charitable distribution.” Because the gift would be made from a tax deferred account, Dick could not itemize the amount as a charitable contribution. This method of giving was allowed in 2006 and 2007 and has been extended by Congress.

## *The Recipe*

### *Ingredient:*

- ❖ Traditional or Roth IRA owned by a person 70½ or older

### *Tool Needed:*

- ❖ Distribution form from IRA trustee

### *Results:*

- ❖ Immediate gift to public charity—up to \$100,000
- ❖ Gift offsets required minimum distribution, reducing taxable income
- ❖ Estate is reduced for tax purposes

### *Costs:*

- ❖ None

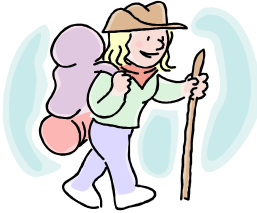
