## *Pastoral Message on Historic ELCA Votes*

On Friday, Aug. 21, the ELCA Churchwide Assembly approved a series of changes in ministry policies that open the ministry of the church to gay and lesbian pastors and other professional workers living in committed relationships. Following these historic votes, Bishop Claire S. Burkat issued the following pastoral message to the Synod:

**Our Lord Jesus Christ said, “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment, and the second is like it; you shall love your neighbor as yourself.” Matthew 22:36-39**

After years of deliberation, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) has adopted ministry policies, which I support, that will allow congregations to recognize and welcome the spiritual gifts of gay and lesbian leaders. As we attempt to live into a process that, for some, will be a welcome change, and for others will be a profound disappointment, I pray the Holy Spirit will guide us and bless us.

Our church has accomplished a remarkable process of careful, respectful, and sensitive listening, even though this issue is very difficult to reconcile. For this reason, we agreed as an assembly to commit ourselves “to bear one another’s burdens, love the neighbor, and respect the bound consciences of all.” It is evident that faithful people are not in agreement on the issue of recognizing, supporting, and holding accountable lifelong, monogamous, same-gender relationships and whether these people should be allowed to serve as rostered leaders of the church. We have agreed in principle that no congregation will be forced to recognize same-gender partnerships or call ministers in them, but those wishing to recognize such partnerships and call people who are in them will be allowed to do so.

We have agreed to find ways to allow congregations who choose to recognize, support, and hold publicly accountable life-long, monogamous, same-gender relationships. Further, we have agreed to find a way for such people to serve as rostered leaders in this church.

This is a change in our church culture that will take time, patience, and discernment to live into. There are congregations that are not ready or willing to accept this change. The synod will not impose any leader on a congregation.

As one of the first women ordained in the Lutheran Church in the 1970s, I know what it is like to be excluded from opportunities for ministry. I know from experience that change and acceptance take time, patience, and openness to new expressions of ministry. Once again the church is challenged to live into a significant change. My prayer is for us to move forward with love and respect for one another.

# Notes from the Worship and Music Committee

## SAINT PAUL'S USHERS

Thanks to all of you for performing this vital part of the church's ministry. As a reminder, these are the functions that ushers should perform:

- Arrive at church 20 minutes before the beginning of the service.
- Greet worshipers and hand them a bulletin when they enter the narthex.
- If you are standing outside the entry to the sanctuary, open the doors for worshipers, especially if they need help.
- At some point during the service, go to the balcony, count the number of worshipers and enter the total in the book at the podium in the narthex.
- Collect the offering during the service and return the offering plates and the vessels containing the wine to the altar.
- After the service, clean the sanctuary by picking up all bulletins and any trash left in the pews and making sure that all hymnbooks are facing forward in the hymn racks.

## THE NEW ROBES ARE HERE!

The new robes for choir members, acolytes and assisting ministers have arrived and will make their debut on Rally Day, September 13. If you will be wearing one of these, please note the following:

- The choir members' robes are in the closets in the room behind the choir room, as before. The closets are labeled, and each hanger has a label with the choir member's name on it. Extra adult robes for new or visiting singers are in the men's closet. There are also extra robes in the children's/youths' closet.

- The acolytes' and assisting ministers' robes have a new home in the closet to the left of Pastor Skip's office. Several assisting ministers were measured for robes, either because they were unusually tall or because they seemed to be of a typical size so that others could wear the same robe. Consequently some of these robes are labeled; however, they can be worn by someone else and are not reserved strictly for the person whose name is on them. Just be sure not to take a robe with a name on it if that person is assisting. There are also extra robes in the closet.
- Everyone is asked to take good care of these new robes; please hang them up carefully after using them, and take them home for washing when needed (washing instructions are inside the robe) but otherwise please leave them at church, since they are church property.

May we wear our new robes to the glory of God.

# HOW DO I FIT INTO ST. PAUL'S MUSIC MINISTRY?

**A**s we finish one season and look forward to another, it is a good time to look at the various musical ensembles that make our worship, and to perhaps consider whether God is calling you to lend your musical talents to one or more of our groups.

**THE ADULT CHOIR** sings every week from September through June, and rehearses Thursday evenings from 7:30 until 9:00. We sing the late service, except on the third Sunday of the month, when we sing the early service with the Matins Choir.

**THE MATINS CHOIR** is for singers who wish to provide liturgical leadership in the early (9:00) service. We gather at 8:40 a.m., practice the liturgy of the day, robe, and lead the worship at 9:00. Occasionally, we join with the Adult Choir for a special event. There is no weeknight rehearsal for the Matins Choir, so the time commitment is limited.

**THE YOUTH CHOIR** is open to all youth from 7<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grades. We sing the late service on the third Sunday of the month. Occasionally, the Youth Choir will sing with the adults. We practice on Sunday evenings after confirmation class (7:00 until 8:00 p.m.).

**THE CHILDREN'S CHOIR** sings the late service on the first Sunday of the month, and practices every Thursday evening from 6:30 until 7:30 p.m. We work very hard on learning the liturgy as well as our anthems. The group is open to all children in 1<sup>st</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup> grades. I have said this before, but it bears repeating: I feel you can give your child no greater gift as a young Christian than to send him or her to choir. Our children *learn* worship through *leading* worship. They are not the leaders of tomorrow: they are the leaders of today.

**THE BRASS ENSEMBLE:** a few years ago we were able to form a brass ensemble entirely from St. Paul's members, but many of our young musicians have moved on to college or careers, so we need new brass players to build the group up again! If you play a brass instrument yourself, or know a budding brass player at St. Paul's, please be sure to let me know. I also need **instrumentalists** to play services and special events throughout the year. If you play the piano, or a

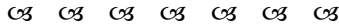

wind, percussion, or stringed instrument, please tell me so I can incorporate your talents as well.

Finally, even if you do not feel that your musical gifts are sufficient to lead worship, you can join the most important musical ensemble of all—the **singing congregation**. As important as our choirs are to the liturgy, they cannot replace a congregation that sings with joy. Our Lutheran singing tradition at St. Paul's is a source of great joy to me, and often prompts positive comments from visitors.

## *Gift Planning Corner*

*We all get many phone calls asking for donations. We all get many solicitations in the mail from various charities. While they are all probably worthwhile, each one of us has a passion for some type of social ministry as well as a deep passion for our church. The purpose of the Gift Planning Corner is to get you to think about what your individual passions are, and how you want to remember them as part of your personal, longer-term stewardship goals.*

*The story below and subsequent Gift Planning articles will show you real life examples of people who wanted to remember their church and its ministries, and how they were able to accomplish their stewardship goals through various gifts.*

### ***Dad Has Too Much Life Insurance\****

Dad liked Ecclesiastes 3:1, *There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven*. Dad was one of Thrivent Financial's best life insurance customers. He bought his first policy when he was young and additional policies when he and Mom started a family. Now he has policies that they no longer need. He was surprised to learn that he can use them to help the Lutheran agency where he volunteers.

Dad met with an ELCA Foundation gift planner and discovered that there are several ways he could help his church.

1. He can give the church a paid-up policy that can be cashed and used for the church's endowment fund or for a specific project;
2. He can give the church the policy he is still paying on, and claim a charitable tax deduction each year for all future payments;
3. Or, he can name the church as the beneficiary of one or more of his life insurance policies—earmarking a quiet, future gift for the church. *(cont'd. on next page)*

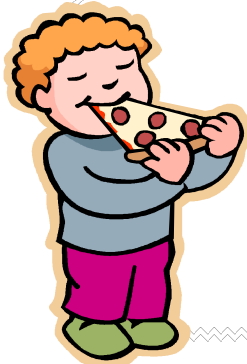
