Pastor's Letter



Dear siblings in Christ,

April 2024

Alleluia, Christ is risen! He is risen indeed, alleluia! ....now what? Each year, we join the joyful proclamation sharing the good news of Christ's triumph over death and the grave. The forces of evil and hate do not get to have the last word—God does. And God speaks a word of love, of new creation, and of salvation—lives freed from sin and despair and free for life in God's kingdom.

But what comes next? If Easter morning is the culminating moment of Jesus' story, the climax of the scriptural narrative, what are we meant to do after Easter? This year, in the seven-week season of Easter, we'll be thinking about exactly that in a new sermon series titled *Go: The Church in Act-ion*.

Every Easter season, our first lesson each Sunday is a reading from the Acts of the Apostles, the account of the early church. We see what the earliest followers of Jesus did after his death and resurrection. We see how their lives were different because of everything that had taken place. And we see how they tried to shape a community—a church—that reflected the teachings and values of Jesus and would be part of his mission to usher in God's kingdom.

The early church wasn't perfect (go and read 1 & 2 Corinthians if you need examples), but they did strive to live a different way. They did strive to make God's love real in their words and actions, in the way that they treated each other, and in their witness to others.

I hope you can join us as we look at what the early church was up to and explore what lessons and callings the Book of Acts has to offer the church today. Go: Believers in Act-ion:

April 7: Active in Generosity and Service April 14: Active in Repentance April 21: Active in Healing April 28: Active in Breaking Barriers May 5: Active in Giving and Receiving Hospitality May 12: Active in Tending to its Communal Health

Our partners from Trellis (<u>https://trellis4tomorrow.org/</u>) were on site with us after worship to put in our spring crops: collards, red, green, and napa cabbages, kale, potatoes, lettuce, arugula, turnips, and peas.

We will need volunteers after worship each week to help with harvesting (beginning at the end of April/early May), assistance with weeding and pruning throughout the weeks, and help with summer and fall planting.

### Parenting Book Group: "The Power of Showing Up" by Dr. Dan Siegel & Dr. Tina Payne Bryson



This book shares the latest brain and attachment research - through stories, scripts, simple strategies, illustrations, and tips - helps you feel empowered to honor the Four S's: (feeling safe and seen as well as being soothed and secure) in all kinds of situations.

The book will help us understand that mistakes and missteps are repairable and that it's never too late to mend broken trust. This book is a powerful guide to cultivating a child's emotional landscape and finding the joy in parenting and building deeper relationships with our children.

Finally, after five years the St Paul's Women's Retreat was held on February 23 and 24, 2024 at the St Raphaela Center in Haverford, PA. Due to the Covid shutdown we were unable to hold Women's Retreat in March 2020. The sale of the Franciscan Spiritual Center (our usual retreat location), ongoing Covid outbreaks, and concerns about large group gatherings kept us from planning retreats in 2021, 2022, and 2023. The last retreat in 2019 seems like so long ago.

Our leader, Pastor Maggie Ainslie is the Director of Pastoral Care at Doylestown Hospital where she supervises 45 paid and volunteer chaplains. Her prior work includes pastoral care work in the Jefferson Hospital system, and 11 years as a pastor at Atonement Lutheran Church in Fishtown.

It was a joyous gathering; there were 25 of us in attendance. Unfortunately, three others were unable to attend at the last minute, so we missed Carol Hammarberg, Lynda McNab, and Hazel Pelletreau.

The retreat opened on Friday night with dinner at the Center, an introductory session, and fellowship which included refreshments brought by the participants. The program continued on Saturday with morning and afternoon sessions, breakfast and lunch in the Center's cafeteria, and ended at 3pm following closing worship led by Pastor Maggie and Pastor Laura.

Pastor Maggie led our retreat discussions on the topic of "Vocation: Deepening your sense of calling at work and in life." During the Friday night session, we looked back, tried to remember who our mentors were and what we dreamed of being when we grew up. On Saturday morning we talked about and reflected upon where we are now in our lives; note that the Serenity Prayer was important during this session! The afternoon conversations revolved around our hopes, dreams and plans for the future.

A few comments from attendees confirm our joy at being together for a retreat again.

"I found it to be much more personally meaningful than I would have expected it to be. Maggie was wonderful. I'd love to see her as the leader again. She has such an easy and comfortable way about her."

"I honestly think this was the most meaningful for me. Pastor Maggie Ainslie was a wonderful leader, and the insights that everyone shared were so helpful and full of wisdom. The time we spent together was such a blessing, and getting to spend time with the people I didn't know well was so nice."


"It was great meeting some of the newer women as well. I had some thoughtful conversations as well as some terrific laughs."
