## Pastor's Letter



VBS at St. Paul's: Operation Restoration

VBS is almost here! While we're in the thick of logistical planning for this year's vacation bible school, I have been trying to find moments to reflect on the theme for this year: Operation Restoration. I wanted to share some thoughts on what this theme offers to us.

This theme comes from the work of Pastor Daniel Erlander, an artist, author, and theologian who published seven books during his life (he died in the summer of 2022). Parents and children here at St. Paul's who have taken our first communion and confirmation classes will be familiar with two of his books, *A Place for You* and *Manna and Mercy*.

The theme of restoration is a constant presence in Erlander's work, as well as a constant presence in the bible stories Erlander draws inspiration from. In the simple words of his work *A Place for You*, he writes, "God sent Jesus into the world to show that God loves everybody." In Jesus God acted to reconcile our broken humanity and restore the universe to the peace and wholeness God intended from its inception. Jesus offers hope, healing, forgiveness, mercy, and rest to all the world.

The Operation Restoration program invites kids to hear this message and provides a window to the different ways they can participate in God's ongoing work of restoration. Each of the five days emphasizes a different restorative action: feed, heal, forgive, pray, and rest. Like our past VBS programs, kids learn through storytelling, art, science, music, games, and snacks.

Thinking about God's actions in and through Jesus as a means for restoration is very compelling, as is the idea that each of us as faithful people has a role to play. I am very much looking forward to sharing these ideas with the young people at our vacation bible school. Also, I am profoundly grateful for everyone that has volunteered to be a part of VBS this year! There are still plenty of ways to be involved and space for more kids to register.

May God's restorative love be with you today and always.

#### Noëlle Streuber-Eden, Winner

St. Paul's accomplished violinist, Noëlle Streuber-Eden, won the 2023 Philadelphia Young Artists Orchestra (PYAO) Concerto Competition! She performed the first movement of Henryk Wieniawski's Violin Concerto #2 in D Minor, Op. 22 at the Kimmel on May 21st.

She received her first violin lesson at the tender age of three and three-quarters. An eighth grader with a knack for advanced mathematics, violinist Noëlle is a transplant from the Greater Chicago Area and currently studies with Guillaume Combet in Philadelphia, as well as conducting with Maestra Rosalind Erwin of the PYAO.

She has performed in master classes for Almita Vamos, Jennifer Koh, Jung-Min Amy Lee, and Angela Sin Ying Chan and also taken lessons



from Desirée Ruhstrat. An avid orchestra musician, Noëlle currently serves as the Concertmaster of the Philadelphia Young Artists Orchestra and has previously been co-concert master and soloist in the Philharmonic and Concert Orchestra of the Chicago Youth Symphony Orchestra. She can often be heard performing at Temple University's Center for Gifted Young Musicians and with the Settlement Music School's Ann Newman String Quartet, for which she has received an Advanced Study scholarship. Noëlle has won multiple national and international recognitions and awards, most recently the Ninth Annual Concerto Competition of the Philadelphia Young Artists Orchestra (2023), the 2022 International Clara Schumann Competition, the 2022 Opus Statewide Competition, and the 2022 Elite International Music Competition (which will take her to Carnegie Hall later this year).

Noëlle plays on an instrument made in 2011 by Chicago-area luthier Gary Rickman, and is a die-hard fan of Hilary Hahn, Ray Chen, and Twoset Violin. She lives on the Main Line with her family and her two cats, Herman and Millie.

Apart from Noëlle's occasional performances at St. Paul's worship service, she is also the youngest member of our livestream camera crew. Noëlle will perform on June 4th, Holy Trinity Sunday service.
